Initiated in 1984, the Writers Exchange Contest was created to introduce emerging poets and fiction writers to literary communities outside of their home state, and provide them with a network for professional development. To date, 82 writers from 33 states have participated.

The winning Maryland poet and fiction writer will be brought to New York City for an all-expenses-paid visit in October 2012. While they are in New York, Poets & Writers will arrange meetings for the writers with literary agents, editors, and prominent writers. Their visit will culminate in a public reading. We hope you will review the attached guidelines, and, if you qualify, submit your manuscript to us.

APPLICATION GUIDELINES

PLEASE REVIEW ALL GUIDELINES CAREFULLY—
INCORRECTLY SUBMITTED MANUSCRIPTS WILL BE DISQUALIFIED.

Eligible Writers

Maryland resident poets and fiction writers who:

1. Have never published a book, or;
2. Have published no more than one full-length book in the genre in which they are applying, and;
3. Have resided in Maryland for at least two years prior to the date they submit their manuscripts.

Writers may apply in the poetry and/or fiction categories (only one manuscript per category).

Writers may not be previous winners of contests sponsored by Poets & Writers, Inc.

Finalists will be asked to submit verification of publications and residency.

Employees of Poets & Writers, Inc. are not eligible.

Awards

One Maryland poet and one Maryland fiction writer will be selected. The names of the winning writers will be announced by April 16, 2012 on our website. Each winner will receive:

1. A \$500 honorarium;
2. A trip to New York City in October 2012 to meet with editors, agents, publishers, and other writers. All related travel/lodgings expenses and a per diem stipend are covered by Poets & Writers. Winners will also give a public reading of their work; and
3. One-month residency at the Jentel Artist Residency Program in Wyoming.

Manuscript Submission Requirements

Poetry manuscripts should not exceed ten pages, single or double-spaced (minimum of 7 pages).

Fiction manuscripts should not exceed 25 pages and must be double-spaced. Fiction manuscripts may include stories and/or excerpts from novels.

Published work may be included; however, no reprints from books or magazines are acceptable. Published work must be retyped to conform with the rest of manuscript and should not be identified as published work.

All work must be original and written in English; translations are not eligible. There are no restrictions on style or subject matter.

Manuscript Submission Procedures

Submit **five collated** copies of your manuscript. Your name or address should **not** appear anywhere on the manuscript.

Enclose a signed application entry form with your manuscript.

All manuscripts must be postmarked no later than
December 1, 2011.

If you want Poets & Writers to acknowledge receipt of your manuscript, please enclose a stamped, self-addressed postcard.

Manuscripts will not be returned, and Poets & Writers can not assume responsibility for the loss of manuscripts.
