- Editing occasional articles, essays, and interviews for the Literary Life, Practical Writer, and Feature departments of *Poets & Writers Magazine*.
- Contributing articles, essays, and interviews to the magazine and website as needed.
- Reading and evaluating submissions.
- Assisting in the fact-checking of articles.
